


Year Three and Four Home Learning Grid Term 2: Smashing Saxons & Vicious Vikings

Make an addition and subtraction board game. Remember to include rules!	Create a map of Saxon England to show how the land was separated into kingdoms.	Write some sentences about Christmas containing verbs. What do you do in the lead up to Christmas and on Christmas?	Visit a museum or library, or research Anglo Saxon people and their daily life.	Make a Viking Village. Use your imagination...this could even be edible!	Evaluate your board game or model. See teacher for an evaluation sheet.
Find out more about Remembrance Day. Present your findings in an interesting and thoughtful way. You could write a prayer.	Research why we celebrate Christmas. What happened to Jesus? Why is it so important? Present your information in any way you wish.	Create a Saxon v Viking battleship co-ordinate game. Remember to include rules!	Analyse Anglo Saxon runes and record the runic alphabet. Write a message for someone else to decode. Think of a creative way of presenting this.	Research a mythical creature and create a descriptive story about it. Remember to describe the monster's character in detail.	Listen to two Christmas songs, 1 modern and 1 traditional. Explain what each one it is about. Ask your family to evaluate the songs. Which do they prefer and why?
